OCTOBER 2020 UPDATE

OVERVIEW

October has seen the restart of VIY's national programme of work with 220 secondary schools up to the end of March 2021 (in partnership with The Careers & Enterprise Company), targeting students at risk of exclusion and/or disengagement. We've also continued our project work with the GLA (Greater London Authority) and Sport England, and have now delivered 18 of the 100+projects we're set to deliver in total nationwide over Sept 2020 - March 2021.

The nine projects we've completed in October have involved 139 young volunteers aged 14-24, 11 new trade skills mentors (local professional tradespeople), with 40% of the young learners typically achieving an Entry Level 3 City & Guilds qualification and 15% directly progressing to a further education, training or employment opportunity beyond VIY.

Joseph Yohannes, 25, first took part in VIY at Croydon Rugby Club in Sept 2020. He was referred into VIY via YMCA Walthamstow, where he is a resident, and was not in permanent employment at the time he started with VIY. Joseph has since volunteered on a further two VIY projects and, having shown great appetite and a natural ability for the work, is now set to be employed as a Peer Mentor on future projects. "VIY has given me opportunities to meet new people and learn new skills which has increased my confidence and boosted my job prospects."
