APRIL 2021 UPDATE

OVERVIEW

VIY is set to have its busiest year to date with at least 130 local community projects already planned for the April 2021-March 2022 financial year period and more than 2,000 young people set to participate. We are also anticipating a record number of VIY learners successfully achieving an Entry Level 3 City & Guilds trade skills qualification (60% of all participants), as well as a record number of participants progressing beyond VIY into further/higher-level training or an apprenticeship or other employment opportunity (25% of all participants). INSPIRING YOUNG PEOPLE TO PURSUE PATHWAYS INTO CONSTRUCTION

Kian Thompson, a Year 11 student at a SEN (Special Education Needs) school in Rotherham, has successfully progressed to a higher-level construction skills course at Rotherham College off the back of taking part in two VIY projects at his school. "My work experience on VIY really got me interested in carpentry and joinery and gave me some entry level skills, as well as information about possible careers in construction. It helped me to decide what to do after leaving school and gave me a goal. So I have now signed up at Rotherham College to start a Level 1 course in joinery and construction skills."

Kian's teacher at Abbey School in Rotherham, James Shaw, adds: "The VIY projects we've run at the school through the Careers & Enterprise Company's Mentoring Fund have been valuable and inspiring for our students, raising career aspirations as well as awareness of the construction sector as accessible and rewarding."

FAREHAM HEATHENS RUGBY CLUB, HAMPSHIRE:

To help increase the club's capacity to accommodate more members, work included converting an under-used physio room into new changing facilities, upgrading the toilets and creating new kit storage space. Most of the young volunteers came from The Key Education Centre, a local Pupil Referral Unit that supports young people disengaged or excluded from mainstream education, as well as from junior members at the club itself.

FIVES & HERONIANS CRICKET CLUB, CHIGWELL, ESSEX:

Running for three weeks, this project involved refurbishing the clubhouse, including the washrooms/ toilets, to make it more appealing to junior players, especially girls. The work was undertaken by young people referred via The Amber Foundation and New City College and included installing a new ceiling and new flooring, creating new storage and seating, and redecoration throughout.
