





As covid restrictions eased, we began a phased return to delivering projects

Kian Thompson was one of 6,000 students across 350 schools impacted though VIY's five-year partnership with the Careers & Enterprise Company (CEC). Our work focused on developing young people's employability skills and their awareness of the construction sector as an accessible and rewarding job pathway.


